## Bridgeville's Sol Kline Department Store

Exactly when Solomon Kline located to Bridgeville is unknown. World War I draft records list his year of birth as 1874. According to U. S. census records, he was either born in Russia or Germany, although his great-granddaughter recalls being told he was born in Lithuania. Those records also reveal that he immigrated to the U. S. in 1892 and became a naturalized U. S. citizen in 1902.

An article in the *Evening Star* (Wash., D.C.) on September 2, 1903, reported that the marriage of Mr. Solomon Kline of Bridgeville, DE to Miss Helen Fanny Goodman of Annapolis, MD, on September 1, was historic in that it was the first Jewish wedding in Annapolis. Goodman relatives in Seaford, DE were in the wedding party.

*"Five hundred guests from Baltimore, Washington and Annapolis witnessed the ceremony and attended the dance and reception that followed. A special train took the bridal party out of the city tonight."*

An early letterhead (shown below) has a photograph of the Sol Kline Department Store occupying the flat-roofed building so familiar to Bridgeville residents as well as the building on its west side that later became the American Store which was a grocery store. This letterhead was a recent donation from Jim Bowden.

An advertisement from the first Bridgeville High School newspaper, "The Tattler" in 1925 (*shown below*) reveals that a branch store was located in Greenwood, DE. How long or how successful that venture by Mr. Kline was has not been discovered.

From his writings as "The Old Timer" in the *Seaford Leader*, Koder Collison described the store and Mr. Kline this way:

*"The Sol Kline Department Store was truly a modern day emporium even back in those late 'teens and 'twenties. First class, name brand, merchandise was available; ready-made dresses as well as bolt goods could be purchased along with notions and costume jewelry, handbags, shoes, and what have you. Curleyheaded Sol Kline was a joy. Always smiling, he had a kind word for all, regardless of their economic standing."*

## Museum & Park Matters

**New signs** that list the "Rules and Regulations" regarding Cahall Park have been ordered and will be installed soon. Hours that the park will open are from 6:00 a.m. - 10:00 p.m. Littering, illegal drugs/alcoholic beverages, smoking, loud music, gambling, skateboarding, and playing in the pond area are prohibited.

**New gutters** have been installed on the Old Fire House/museum. It is hoped that this improvement will divert some of the water away from the building although other measures will have to be taken to improve the moisture leakage that seeps into the building around the windows.

## Meeting - January 8



*...not one house to be seen on either side of the road, though the whole in view for 4 miles is composed of pine and cedar trees, for which ships regularly supply distant climes destitute of timber."*

Last January, Emalu Myer Simpson presented a very informative slideshow on "Bridgeville in the 18th Century."

She spoke about pre-1700 land surveys and the network of roads and bridges that existed in the area of early Bridgeville before Gov. Cannon laid out the present grid of streets.

Early landowners were the Hailes, Hatfields, Browns and Sordens. After the program, members studied a large map she brought showing land surveys of the Northwest Fork Hundred.

In an attempt to explain the process of accessioning items into the Society's collection, some of the members of the BHS Archives Committee prepared a slideshow on the "Past, Present, and Future of Our Museum." Sol Kline died in 1942 and ownership of the store passed to his daughter, Hattie, and her husband, George Tuck. The store continued to prosper until the arrival of the big-box chain stores in the early 1980s.

After the Tucks closed the store, it was briefly used as an antique store before being purchased by Ralph and Paul Adams, Inc. It was demolished soon after and all that remains is an empty lot.

Three of the counters from the Sol Kline Department Store are being used in H. C. Layton's Hardware today.
