Museum & Park Matters

To attract more visitors to our museum in the Old Fire House, the Society purchased an new "j-flag" to be placed in front of the museum on days that it is scheduled to be opened. A new "sandwich board" was also purchased, but had not arrived when the photo on the left was taken.



It must have helped as the number of visitors has doubled on the Sunday open dates.

Thanks to Byron Lewis, a sleeve was fabricated to cover the flag holder when it is not in use decreasing the danger of someone falling over the post.

Cahall Park has seen much activity this year as eight weddings were held in the park. The rentals for those weddings has certainly contributed to the maintenance costs.

Interesting Donation

Rita and Roger Hovermale recently donated a key to the door of Jacob's School that was located near Royal Farms at the intersection of Routes 404 and 13. The one-room school operated from 1863 until it consolidated with Bridgeville in 1929.

The 5½" folding key (with lock and hinges) were purchased at William Cannon's Hardware in Bridgeville about 1917 for \$18.67 when a new vestibule was built on the school.

The key had belonged to Rita's father, Virgil Cannon, who wrote a book on **The History of Jacob's School**.



Apple Scrapple

The BHS museum and the Davis Building will be open on Saturday, October 12 from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. for the Apple Scrapple Festival. The recent donation of a Bridgeville-made "Durbin" farm wagon from Mark and Kathy Williams will be on display for the first time in front of the museum.

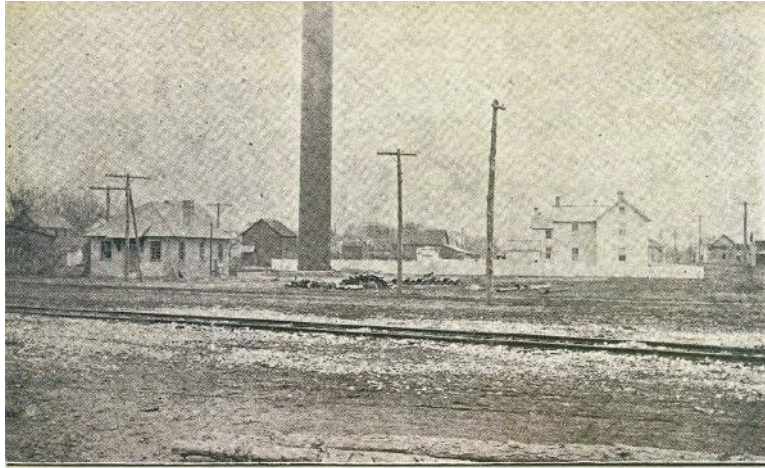
New Brochure
